VALUE YOUR VOTE - GENERAL ELECTION STATEMENT

The Catholic Bishops' of England and Wales have issued a statement on the forthcoming General Election. The Bishops highlight the duty of all citizens - not just Catholics - to help shape politics that are "rooted in the service of human rights and peace". The statement concentrates on the key issues.

In making judgments about how to vote, the Bishops ask that the following are carefully considered and, indeed candidates can be asked how they will uphold:

- The innate dignity of every human being; defending both the child in the womb, the good of the mother and an understanding of the immeasurable good of a child not yet horn?
- The dignified care for those who are terminally ill and dying while resisting the false compassion of assisted suicide or euthanasia?
- The right of parents to educate their children in accordance with their faith and support the work of Catholic schools in their contribution to society and their promotion of the common good?
