Finally we ask you Lord to guide us in the knowledge that we all have worth in ourselves and that we are all of equal value in your eyes, through Jesus Christ Our Lord, Amen.

ASH WEDNESDAY ~ Day of Fasting or Abstinence or other act of self-denial


