Reflection

What is our greatest treasure, something for which we would sell everything we own? Do we ever dream what we would do if we won the lottery? In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us two short parables about the Kingdom of Heaven being like a treasure hidden in a field or a pearl of great value, and challenges our response to this Kingdom.

What is the Kingdom of Heaven or the Kingdom of God? The catechism explains: 'The Kingdom of God lies ahead of us. It is brought near in the Word incarnate, it is proclaimed throughout the whole Gospel and it has come in Christ's death and resurrection...it is in our midst in the Eucharist...The Kingdom of God means Christ himself' (CCC2816). Both the people described in the parables were searching: the treasure in the field was hidden and probably took some effort to find, the merchant was looking among many pearls to find the one of great value and this probably needed concentration and a discerning eye. We are encouraged to seek the presence of Jesus in our daily lives: 'seek first his Kingdom and his righteousness' (Matt 6:33), 'Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you' (Matt 7:7). What they find is of enormous value for they both sell everything they own to acquire it: this is their chance of a lifetime. We can ask ourselves, how much do we treasure Jesus and our life with him?

The words: 'sells all that he has', can seem a little frightening to us at first, but it is important to note that the man is full of joy (Matt 13:44). Contrast this with the rich young man Jesus met who was unable to give away all he possessed and 'went away sorrowful' (Matt 19:22). What we are asked to do is to give first place in our hearts to Jesus and to lay down anything which may interfere with this. This may mean 'selling' some of our time in order to meet Jesus in prayer; 'selling' the temptation to do unnecessary work or shopping and make Sunday a special day for rest, worship of God and time with our families; it may mean 'selling' our approval from friends and colleagues in order to be honest or chaste in our relationships. All these things can be done with joy when we realise how great the treasure we receive in exchange.

News from Uganda During the pandemic, starvation continues to be the big problem in Fr. Vincent's Mission area. Many people work in shops which have been closed during lockdown, while others work on farms in the bush and need transport to reach them. No work means no pay. Using money sent from the Mission Fund Fr Vincent drives 20 miles in his pickup truck to buy beans, rice, maize flour and dried fish to distribute to those in need. Recently we have been able to send £4,500 from the Uganda Mission Fund to the White Fathers in London. This has been acknowledged and will be sent by electronic banking to Fr. Vincent's Provincial in Kampala. The money will then be made available to Fr. Vincent for his work. Father will receive the whole amount we sent without any deductions. Please pray for Father at this very difficult time
