Reflection All Saints 2020

Somewhere in this bulletin you'll find the answers to the following three-part question.

Who is associated with these phrases?

1. Nice to see you, to see you...
2. The lady is not for turning
3. This time next year, we'll be millionaires

All of us use phrases such as these from time to time in our ordinary day to day conversations- we might 'borrow' a phrase from someone well known like one of the above, or we might have a phrase of our own that we use without even realizing that we are doing so.

These phrases have become known as catch phrases and they can pop up in all manner of circumstances.

Many years ago now I worked with a colleague who often asked people to do things for her. She was the boss, so I suppose that was a natural thing for her to do. When such things were done, no matter what they were, she'd say 'You're a Saint' to the individual who had done whatever had been asked of them. That was her catch phrase.

I suppose that was her way of saying thank you, I am pleased with you.

Over time, she must have called everyone in the office a Saint, which in that environment sort of diminished being called a Saint in the first place. It was a bit of a shock to new starters who thought they were being singled out as special to be told that's what she says to everyone...

But those new starters were special. They like us are all called by God to be Saints in the true sense of that word, that is to be one of those who we can be certain has lived their lives in such a way that there can be no doubt that they are in Heaven- those whose lives and deaths we commemorate this weekend.

Pick a Saint this coming week, any Saint you like, and learn something new about them, something perhaps that helped them on their way to Heaven. Then try and follow their example in your own lives in the hope that one day God Himself will say to you 'You're a Saint'.

Pope Francis' Monthly Intentions for November: Artificial Intelligence: We pray that the progress of robotics and artificial intelligence may always serve humankind.

News from Uganda: The lockdown in Uganda has been eased more. Churches can now open but only 70 people may attend each Mass. Father has been busy trying to explain and control the number who come for Mass, but many do not understand the restrictions. He writes “It is indeed hectic and infections are rising. Every Sunday I first work as door bouncer and then celebrate Mass. Out of the 10 village churches I have opened only 2. For the rest they will have to wait till the situation gets better, because we cannot afford to sanitise all as required.” Please pray for Fr. Vincent and his people.

First Reading

Apocalypse 7:2-4,9-14

I, John, saw another angel rising where the sun rises, carrying the seal of the living God; he called in a powerful voice to the four angels whose duty was to devastate land and sea, 'Wait before you do any damage on land or at sea or to the trees, until we have put the seal on the foreheads of the servants of our God.' Then I heard how many were sealed: a hundred and forty-four thousand, out of all the tribes of Israel.

After that I saw a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language; they were standing in front of the throne and in front of the Lamb, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. They shouted aloud, 'Victory to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels who were standing in a circle round the throne, surrounding the elders and the four animals, prostrated themselves before the throne, and touched the ground with their foreheads, worshipping God with these words, 'Amen. Praise and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and strength to our God for ever and ever. Amen.'

One of the elders then spoke, and asked me, 'Do you know who these people are, dressed in white robes, and where they have come from?' I answered him, 'You can tell me, my lord.' Then he said, 'These are the people who have been through the great persecution, and they have washed their robes white again in the blood of the Lamb.'

Matthew 5:1-12a

Seeing the crowds, Jesus went up the hill. There he sat down and was joined by his disciples. Then he began to speak. This is what he taught them:

'How happy are the poor in spirit; theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Happy the gentle: they shall have the earth for their heritage.

Happy those who mourn: they shall be comforted. Happy those who hunger and thirst for what is right: they shall be satisfied.

Happy the merciful: they shall have mercy shown them. Happy the pure in heart: they shall see God.

Happy the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God. Happy those who are persecuted in the cause of right: theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

'Happy are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of calumny against you on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.'
