Reflection for Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe 2020

The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, which we celebrate this weekend marks the end of the Church's Year.

For me, this Solemnity always feels like something of a milestone - a place from which to look back and take stock of the year that has just passed.

Usually this is a very pleasant experience. In previous years I've found myself smiling when bringing to mind our Easter celebrations, or else laughing out loud when remembering something funny that happened.

This last year though has been rather different, dominated as it has been by COVID 19 since March or thereabouts. Every single one of us, young and old alike, has had to adapt to what has become known as 'the new normal' - and that itself seems to change quite frequently. Just as we get used to 'socially distanced Masses' wearing masks and so on, we have to stop...

Am I being too gloomy? I think I probably am.

Whilst it's true that we can't do a lot of the things we used to take for granted, we have found alternative ways of doing those things - for example live streaming of the Mass. And I doubt if there is one among us who has not found something new to do - gardening for me!

Yet in all of this there are many things that are constant and upon which we can rely, come what may.

God is looking after us - the Prophet Ezekiel reminds us of this in our first reading - 'The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view'.

God loves us - He sent us His only Son Jesus Christ to conquer death and to show us the way to Him.

God is ever present - even when we think He has abandoned us.

There is much then to celebrate today, and to look forward to - including a new Church Year that begins next weekend. Even though this last year has not been quite what anyone expected let's still take the opportunity to thank God for it - and for the gift of His Son Jesus Christ, our shepherd and our King.

Ezekiel 34:11-12,15-17

First Reading

The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest – it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them. As for you, my sheep, the Lord says this: I will judge between sheep and sheep, between rams and he-goats.

1 Corinthians 15:20-26,28

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death, for everything is to be put under his feet. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all.

Gospel

Matthew 25:31-46

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left.'

'Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me."

'Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me."

'And they will go away to eternal punishment, and the virtuous to eternal life.'
