We are entering the season of Advent. Advent is a time of waking from darkness to light, from hopelessness to hope, and from hatred to love. In the Gospel Jesus says, "Be Vigilant at all times and stay awake, because you do not know the day when your Master is coming." How can we be vigilant, stay awake, and be prepared? This is possible only through our prayers and penance and by sharing our blessings with others. Our every act of kindness and love and every act of self-sacrifice for others is a small step in welcoming Jesus into our midst.

If we use the days of Advent as an opportunity to reconcile with those who have hurt us, if we use Christmas as an opportunity to share our time with the less fortunate, if we look for ways to be more loving to others, especially those within our own homes and communities, then we will "be vigilant and stay awake" to welcome Jesus in our hearts and homes.

We invite your Spirit into this beautiful Advent season. Renew our sense of holy anticipation, let us be those who are waiting eagerly for Jesus to come again. More than anything, we ask that you be glorified in this season of expectation. Amen.

ADVENT – Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle Resources

Advent is when the Church re-sets the calendar of our remembering and celebrating the saving work of Christ. This Advent is more challenging due to the pandemic. A set of resources have been created by Clergy and Laity from across the Hexham and Newcastle Diocese and are offered as a life-buoy, remedy and prayer book for the days ahead. Included in the resources are:

- **Daily video prayer reflections** compiled by the Youth Ministry Team and entitled 'Wait a minute it's Advent'. This resource is aimed at young people but I am sure will also appeal to a wider audience.
- ➡ Weekly Advent packs designed for those with and without the internet. With
 the hope that those with emails and internet might print them out and deliver
 them to their neighbours in paper form. These weekly packs include daily
 reflections on the readings alongside themed quotes from the Bible and Saints
 and an element of creativity for people stuck indoors. They will run through
 Advent and the Christmas Octave.
- ➡ Weekly Advent videos entitled "Advent in a Pandemic!" These four short Advent reflections are written with this year of disruption and fatigue in mind. They are aimed at parish volunteers, catechists and people looking for light in a darkened sky. (Available from Sunday, 29th November.)

Advent Procession with Carols - This Saturday 28th November at 6.00pm .. Durham Cathedral heralds the beginning of Advent with a service of lessons and carols, looking forward to celebrating both the birth of Jesus at Christmas and the coming of God's Kingdom.

This pre-recorded service will be broadcast on Durham Cathedral's Youtube and Facebook pages. There will be no public service in church at that time. During this processional service Choir and Clergy move eastwards through the cathedral, from darkness into light, proclaiming a message of hope echoed by the readings and liturgy.
