Pentecost

Today we celebrate Pentecost which comes from the word meaning fiftieth. We celebrate with joy the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles, the birth of our church and the descent of the Holy Spirit upon ourselves as baptised Christians. Pentecost at the time of Jesus was day that was celebrated as Shavuot, a week of weeks, 7x7 days after the Sabbath. A day that celebrated the receiving of the gift of the law but was known also as a day when the High Priest received the fruits of the harvest and offered bread in the temple. As Jesus brought the feast of Passover to its fulfilment with his own Sacrifice, it seems correct to expect a greater fulfilment at Pentecost. Jesus the great high priest offers us the fruit of his Sacrifice, the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Maybe today as Christians then just reflect on these simple facts. We are called Christians traditionally not just because we are followers of the teaching of Christ but that we are anointed, consecrated in imitation of Christ. The result of this, is that we have the dwelling in ourselves of the very same spirit who was in Jesus of Nazareth. "God has sent the Spirit of the Son into our hearts" (Galatians 4:6) We have received the Spirit of the Son and no other lesser spirit.

What a joy to think the same Spirit who was in Jesus during his days on earth is in me and you. He is our inseparable companion as St Basil said, the sweet guest of our soul.

Let us take time then to make our bodies fitting and welcoming temples for the third person of the trinity. O Come Holy Spirit.....

- ✓ Please remember to sanitise your hands before you leave church.
- ✓ Please leave church as soon as you have received Holy Communion and remember to adhere to Government guidelines when gathering outside church.

Father gave out 105 kilos of maize seed and also some bean seeds. Unfortunately, there has been a problem with green caterpillars which attack young maize shoots and can eat all the leaves in a week. FAITH WITNESS AGAINST HASSOCKFIELD: In October, the UK government plans to open an Immigration Removal Centre at Hassockfield on the site of the former Medomsley Detention Centre. This will be for 80 women seeking asylum in the UK. The proposal is inhumane, unjust and incompatible with our faith which calls us to recognise the intrinsic dignity of each person. These women are not criminals to be locked up but people like ourselves who have the right to a place of safety and to be treated with respect and compassion. An interfaith prayer service will take place on **Sunday 23rd May at 3.00pm** in as many churches and places of worship as possible as part of a united faith response against Hassockfield. The Youth Ministry Team will join with the Faith Witness and will go live at the same time on YMT's Facebook@youthministryteam.

Introducing Proud Catholics: we are a support group for Catholics in the Diocese who identify as LGBT+ or who are questioning their sexual or gender identity. We were founded in November 2018, and we have recently received endorsement from Bishop Robert and his Council. We aim to provide members with a forum in which they can strengthen their faith and gain confidence as Catholics. First Reading

Acts 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

103(104):1,24,29-31,34

Response: Send forth your spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth.

1. Bless the Lord, my soul!
Lord God, how great you are,
How many are your works, O Lord!
The earth is full of your riches.

Second Reading

Galatians 5:16-25

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When self-indulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desires. Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

Gospel

John 20:19-23

In the evening of the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room here the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you', and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, Peace be with you. 'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Spiritual Communion Prayer - My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as already being there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
