### Reflection 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B

The real threat in any storm is the temptation to think that the Lord has abandoned us. Faith assures us that He is with us even in the storm.

The miracle of the calming of the storm was preserved by the early Church not simply because it was a memorable event that showed the power of God present in Jesus. This incident is a graphic description of what was happening to the early Church Community. Daily they were facing the risk of torture and death as others were suspicious of their different ways. Their faith was being tested and the Lord seemed distant at times. Mark uses this incident then to show that the Disciples themselves, showed a lack of trust even when Jesus was with them.

Jesus is truly present to us in the Blessed Sacrament, the source and very summit of our faith.

The failure to completely trust the Lord is a temptation for all of us as well. In these difficult times brought about by the Covid pandemic, how many of us have thought, have felt, "Lord do you not care"

God is not fickle like ourselves his love for us is bound by his own law; similar to the very laws that determine everything that exists in the universe. Here on earth we have the law of gravity. If we throw a coin in the air a thousand times, a thousand times it will come down. 'What goes up must come down'. The love shown to us by our Lord Jesus is a permanent love, a love that is bound by the Lords own Covenant.

As the psalmist tells us 'O Give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures for ever'

May we always revere his Holy name and rest in the foundation of his love.

There are a lot of malnourished children and the pork would be a source of protein for them. The lockdown has been eased a little and some of the final year students have gone back to school. But in the parish many students have dropped out of school and those that have returned cannot afford the pens and books needed. They knock on Fr. Vincent's door asking for help, with our support he has been able to buy pens and books for more than 28 children. Please pray for Fr. Vincent and his people.

#### Twelfth Sunday- Year B - 20th June 2021

#### First Reading

Job 38:1,8-11

From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer. He said: Who pent up the sea behind closed doors when it leapt tumultuous out of the womb, when I wrapped it in a robe of mist and made black clouds its swaddling bands; when I marked the bounds it was not to cross and made it fast with a bolted gate? Come thus far, I said, and no farther: here your proud waves shall break.

Psalm: 106(107): 23-26,28-32

#### O give thanks to the Lord, for his love endures for ever.

- 1. Some sailed to the sea in ships to trade on the mighty waters.

  These men have seen the Lord's deeds, the wonders he does in the deep.
- **3.** Then they cried to the Lord in their need and he rescued them from their distress. He stilled the storm to a whisper: all the waves of the sea were hushed.
- 2. For he spoke; he summoned the gale, tossing the waves of the sea up to heaven and back into the deep; their souls melted away in their distress.
- 4. They rejoiced because of the calm and he led them to the haven they desired. Let them thank the Lord for his love, for the wonders he does for men.

#### Second Reading

2 Corinthians 5:14-17

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them. From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here.

#### Gospel Mark 4:35-41

With the coming of evening, Jesus said to his disciples, 'Let us cross over to the other side.' And leaving the crowd behind they took him, just as he was, in the boat; and there were other boats with him. Then it began to blow a gale and the waves were breaking into the boat so that it was almost swamped. But he was in the stern, his head on the cushion, asleep. They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him. 'Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.

Spiritual Communion Prayer - My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as already being there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
