In this Sunday's gospel the apostles were upset that others were casting out demons in Jesus' name but he reminds them once again that in His kingdom we do not have to compete against one another for position. Everyone is called to union with God and this union always produces charitable works. It is small details of love like 'giving a cup of cold water' that expresses our commitment in faith. This commitment is nourished in prayer and sacrament; and also in the care for the poor, the neglected and for justice and peace. The reward of Jesus is the joy of being united with him in prayer and in our care and love of others. Appreciation of the good deeds done by others is essential in his Kingdom

Lord, inspire us to read your Scriptures and to meditate upon them day and night. We beg you to give us real understanding of what we need, that we in turn may put its precepts into practice. Yet we know that understanding and good intentions are worthless, unless rooted in your graceful love. So we ask that the words of Scripture may also be not just signs on a page, but channels of grace into our hearts. Amen


