**Reflection Thirtieth Sunday of the Year 2021**

Bartimaeus is a lonely and quietly desperate figure as he sits by the roadside. He is blind and begging, he is physically disabled resulting in him being socially outcast and almost certainly anxious and depressed about life.

As he hears that Jesus is near by he calls out: **'have pity on me!'** a prayer not out of a book or religious practice but straight from his heart. Those four words eloquently describe his desperation. Have you ever prayed from the depths of yourself when you've struggled physically, mentally or spiritually? Are you able put your deepest feelings into words or do you express yourself in the silence of tears? Those around him then encourage him, 'Cheer up! On your feet! He's calling you'. **'He jumped to his feet and came to the Lord'**. Who are the people who encourage you in difficult times, who guides you to the Lord? Spend some time remembering and giving thanks for them.

Then Jesus asks Bartimaeus what he wants – another four short words: **'I want to see'**. Imagine Jesus asking you what you long for – what would you say? Bartimaeus takes three steps that will change his life, he prays from his heart, he responds to those who encourage him, and in faith he places his deepest needs and longings before the Lord. That's what many of us need to do: to be ourselves, to free ourselves from whatever stifles our relationship with God and to trust the Lord with our deepest longings.

### Covid: UPDATE

We have received updated guidance from Bishop Robert regarding our Diocese Covid procedures following the recent meeting of the Bishop's Council. As you are aware, legal restrictions were lifted in July, however local infection rates and hospital admissions are now increasing and health officials in the region are advising that maintaining Covid control measures such as face covering, and social distancing throughout the coming autumn/winter period will be vital to controlling infections. It is still down to all of us to keep each other safe by reducing the potential spread of infections.

Some controls are being relaxed, but a number of measures will continue for the present time so that our churches remain safe places to attend Mass.

- ✓ You will still be asked to sanitise your hands as you enter and leave church
- ✓ It is recommended that you continue to wear a face mask in church, unless you are exempt
- ✓ Churches will continue to be cleaned between Masses and other services
- ✓ Please try to keep 1m distance from those not in your household or 'bubble'
- ✓ The one-way system in church will continue
- ✓ Ministers, servers and readers can return to their normal duties
- ✓ We will no longer be taking contact details for test and trace

Our marshals have a very important role to play in keeping us safe. Please follow their guidance and co-operate with them as they do their job to seat people making best use of all the available space in church.

The obligation to attend weekend Mass remains suspended for the present time. Thank you all for your co-operation and understanding. Fr Mark.

### **Thirtieth Sunday– Year B – 24th October 2021**

#### **First Reading**

The Lord says this: Shout with joy for Jacob! Hail the chief of nations! Proclaim! Praise! Shout: 'The Lord has saved his people, the remnant of Israel!' See, I will bring them back from the land of the North and gather them from the far ends of earth; all of them: the blind and the lame, women with child, women in labour: a great company returning here. They had left in tears, I will comfort them as I lead them back; I will guide them to streams of water, by a smooth path where they will not stumble. For I am a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my first-born son.

#### **Jeremiah 31:7-9**

#### **Psalm:**

***What marvels the Lord worked for us! Indeed we were glad.***

1. When the Lord delivered Zion from bondage, it seemed like a dream. Then was our mouth filled with laughter, on our lips there were songs.

#### **Second Reading**

Every high priest has been taken out of mankind and is appointed to act for men in their relations with God, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins; and so he can sympathise with those who are ignorant or uncertain because he too lives in the limitations of weakness. That is why he has to make sin offerings for himself as well as for the people. No one takes this honour on himself, but each one is called by God, as Aaron was. Nor did Christ give himself the glory of becoming high priest, but he had it from the one who said to him: You are my son, today I have become your father, and in another text: You are a priest of the order of Melchizedek, and for ever.

#### **Hebrews 5:1-6**

#### **Gospel**

As Jesus left Jericho with his disciples and a large crowd, Bartimaeus (that is, the son of Timaeus), a blind beggar, was sitting at the side of the road. When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout and to say, 'Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me.' And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.

#### **Mark 10:46-52**

**Spiritual Communion Prayer - My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as already being there and unite myself wholly to You.
