
This Sunday's gospel tells of the harsh reception Jesus experienced in his home town of Nazareth. The way Jesus was treated was in sharp contrast to the love that St Paul recommends in today's second reading, "Love is always patient and kind." Jesus displayed love all through his entire mission and ministry. If love is always patient and kind, it has to face impatience and unkindness. If love takes no pleasure in other people's sins, then it has to face those who delight in the weaknesses of others. Love is a tough and demanding calling but we do well to follow and imitate the example of Jesus and let his forgiving, tolerating, empowering and saving love be our way to.

Lord, thank you that you are a loving, gracious God and that you've offered us forgiveness and the gift of new life in you. We ask for your help in reminding us that the most important things are not what we do outwardly, it's not based on any talent or gift, but the most significant thing we can do in this life is simply to love you and to choose to love others. World Leprosy Day is observed on the last Sunday of January every year to increase public awareness of leprosy. This year St Francis Leprosy Guild is asking the Catholic community to reflect upon and pray for the work of the Catholic nuns who dedicate their lives to caring for people with leprosy. It is amazing to think that throughout the world, working in remote or impoverished locations, Catholic nuns, with hearts of compassion and dedication, are caring for people with leprosy, visiting those that are alone or isolated and restoring dignity. The best-known Catholic nun in recent times is Saint Teresa of Calcutta, founder of the *Order of Missionaries of Charity* but most Catholic nuns are not in the public eye and it is right that we offer up our thanks, appreciation and prayers for those dedicated Sisters who commit their lives to nursing the sick and in the service of others.

Lord, we remember the many people around the world afflicted by leprosy. May we follow the example of your Son, Jesus, and St Francis of Assisi and show them love and compassion. We pray that they may be freed from the disease and its stigma. We give thanks for those who have been cured. IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING UPDATE . . . Three years ago we held a number of workshops after the Sunday morning Masses to renew the DBS clearances for those parish volunteers who needed it to continue their role. This year those clearances will expire. Those who signed up to the DBS Online Update Service (OUS) will have a very quick and easy renewal, just one form to fill in and no need to bring identity documents. Those who didn't sign up will have to renew as before. The Diocese Safeguarding Department is now urging everyone who needs clearance to renew as soon as possible and sign up to the OUS so that in three years' time, renewal will involve minimal work for everyone.

The Diocese would now like everyone who needs clearance to contact them either directly or through me, Maurice, and tell them if you are signed up or not. The diocese cannot check your OUS status without your permission because of the data protection laws. The phone number is 0191 243 3305. My number is 07531 721 274. Please, everyone who intends to continue their role do this as soon as possible. It will reduce parish costs from £10 per person to nothing. Even if your clearance has several months before it expires, still do it now. If you need any help with anything, I will be only too pleased to help since this will cut my work down a huge amount in the future.
