In this weekend's gospel Jesus offers us the Beatitudes and shows us how to turn negatives such as poverty, hunger and hatred into opportunities to show the special love that God has for those who suffer and feel left behind. This message of love is for all people and is a call for action to help others. Jesus invites us, challenges us to link in with those who are poor, those who are hungry, those who weep for whatever reason and to share in the mission and ministry of Jesus himself.

Gracious God, you have so richly blessed us with life, with love and joy, with hope in the midst of



despair. Help us to be the light of the world, sharing with others that which we have received, boldly proclaiming the good news of your love, finding the seeds of your Kingdom within us and letting your way grow in our lives and throughout the world. Give us eyes to see the ways you are changing the world in which we live. Amen.

RACIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY . . . This year's theme builds on that of the previous year's Racial Justice Sunday 'A Time to Act', which reflected on the importance of everyone recognising themselves, their race, their culture and their history in the life of the Church. The aim in 2022, is to continue these conversations about how we see others in the "Image and Likeness of God". It is an opportunity to focus on the three 'R's of 'Remembering', 'Reflecting' and 'Responding':

- Remembering the importance of racial justice.
- Reflecting on human diversity and thanking God for it.
- **Responding** by working to end injustice, racism and ignorance through prayer and action.

We are encouraged to mark the day by praying the words of Pope Francis taken from his encyclical letter Fratelli Tutti – on fraternity and social friendship:

Come, Holy Spirit, show us your beauty, reflected in all the peoples of the earth, so that we may discover anew that all are important and all are necessary, different faces of the one humanity that God so loves. Amen.

IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING UPDATE . . . Three years ago we held a number of workshops after the Sunday morning Masses to renew the DBS clearances for those parish volunteers who needed it to continue their role. This year those clearances will expire. Those who signed up to the DBS Online Update Service (OUS) will have a very quick and easy renewal, just one form to fill in and no need to bring identity documents. Those who didn't sign up will have to renew as before. The Diocese Safeguarding Department is now urging everyone who needs clearance to renew as soon as possible and sign up to the OUS so that in three years' time, renewal will involve minimal work for everyone.

The Diocese would now like everyone who needs clearance to contact them either directly or through me, Maurice, and tell them if you are signed up or not. The diocese cannot check your OUS status without your permission because of the data protection laws. The phone number is 0191 243 3305. My number is 07531 721 274. Please, everyone who intends to continue their role do this as soon as possible. It will reduce parish costs from £10 per person to nothing. Even if your clearance has several months before it expires, still do it now. If you need any help with anything, I will be only too pleased to help since this will cut my work down a huge amount in the future.

Diocesan Synod Update . . . Our Diocesan synod process has been moving ahead over the last couple of months, and we are now starting to collate the responses from all the diocesan groups and parishes. This is how it will work:

- On Saturday, February 12th representatives from all the partnerships will gather with the Bishop, and together, they will reflect on the input and the process so far.
- Following this meeting, the partnerships are asked to finalise their responses by February 22nd and to pass these to their respective Episcopal Area meetings.
- The Lay Pastoral Forum, which includes representatives of all the Partnership and lay groups in the diocese will compile all the responses received into a submission to the Bishop in early March.
- The Bishop will then consider this, plus the responses from the Clergy, Caritas, and other Diocesan groups and produce his final submission by April 8th
- At each stage, copies of the various submissions will be made available.
