**Walk Against Hunger – CAFOD . . .** CAFOD are asking if people will sign up to 'Walk against Hunger' this Lent. They hope lots of people all over England and Wales will take up the challenge themselves to walk 200km this Lent (walk 5km each day of Lent 40 days - 200km) and get sponsored to raise funds to stamp out hunger, one step at a time. **IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING UPDATE . . .** Three years ago we held a number of workshops after the Sunday morning Masses to renew the DBS clearances for those parish volunteers who needed it to continue their role. This year those clearances will expire. Those who signed up to the DBS Online Update Service (OUS) will have a very quick and easy renewal, just one form to fill in and no need to bring identity documents. Those who didn't sign up will have to renew as before. The Diocese Safeguarding Department is now urging everyone who needs clearance to renew as soon as possible and sign up to the OUS so that in three years' time, renewal will involve minimal work for everyone.

The Diocese would now like everyone who needs clearance to contact them either directly or through me, Maurice, and tell them if you are signed up or not. The diocese cannot check your OUS status without your permission because of the data protection laws. The phone number is 0191 243 3305. My number is 07531 721 274. Please, everyone who intends to continue their role do this as soon as possible. It will reduce parish costs from £10 per person to nothing. Even if your clearance has several months before it expires, still do it now. If you need any help with anything, I will be only too pleased to help since this will cut my work down a huge amount in the future.

**The Chair of St Peter** (Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> February) . . . The Chair of Saint Peter, also known as the Throne of Saint Peter, is a relic conserved in St. Peter's Basilica in Vatican City, This feast brings to mind the mission of teacher and pastor conferred by Christ on Peter, and continued in an unbroken line down to the present Pope. This feast celebrates his authority and endless efforts to build a strong community around the teachings of Christ and has been celebrated since the earliest times in the Christian era.

In 2012, Pope Benedict XVI described the chair as "a symbol of the special mission of Peter and his Successors to tend Christ's flock, keeping it united in faith and in charity." Celebrating the "Chair" of Peter means attributing a strong spiritual significance to it and recognizing it as a privileged sign of the love of God, the eternal Good Shepherd, who wanted to gather his whole Church and lead her on the path of salvation.



O God, Shepherd and Ruler of all the faithful, look favourably on your servant Francis, whom you have set at the head of your Church as her shepherd. Grant, we pray, that by word and example he may be of service to the flock entrusted to his care. Raise up in our own day teachers and prophets inspired by your Spirit, whose voices will give strength to your church and proclaim the reality of your reign. Amen.
