Reflection First Sunday of Lent Year C

I like presiding at Baptisms, the Sacramental stepping-stone that leads on to all of the other Sacraments.

I'm sure that those attending any Baptism look forward to being there- and perhaps also the celebration that often follows!

In today's Gospel we encounter Jesus just after His Baptism. No post Baptism celebration for Him though, no raising of a glass of wine or even a quick bite to eat to mark the occasion. Instead, He is led by the Spirit into the wilderness where He is tempted by the devil. I can remember studying this Gospel passage in school. In my mind, Jesus was tempted three times and each time He literally threw the temptation back at the devil. But to focus on these three temptations sort of misses the point, since Luke tells us clearly that Jesus was '…tempted by the devil for forty days…' and that the three temptations that we all know happened at the end of those forty days when Jesus was hungry. In other words, our Lord was tempted by the devil for each and every hour, each and every minute, each and every second of those forty days. The devil was trying to make Jesus think about Himself, to put Himself first to the exclusion of all else, in particular His Mission to spread the Good News that His Father had sent Him to bring to you and I.

But Jesus would have none of it. He was focused on that Mission, focused on His desire to serve all mankind- including us- so He said 'No'. We too are tempted in all sorts of ways. Every second of every day there is some form of temptation snapping at our heels that will pull us away from God if we give in to it. Let's pray that we like Jesus can say 'No' when we are tempted, such that we too remain focused on those things that are pleasing to God and glorify Him. And as we begin Lent let's ask the same Spirit that filled Jesus to fill us too so that we might worthily accompany our Lord on His journey to Calvary.

First Sunday Lent – Year C – 6th March 2022

First Reading

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement: "My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, the Lord, have given me." 'You must then lay them before the Lord your God, and bow down in the sight of the Lord your God.' Psalm:

90(91):1-2,10-15

Be with me, O Lord, in my distress.

1.He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High and abides in the shade of the Almighty

Second Reading

Scripture says: The word (that is the faith we proclaim) is very near to you, it is on your lips and in your heart. If your lips confess that Jesus is Lord and if you believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, then you will be saved. By believing from the heart you are made righteous; by confessing with your lips you are saved. When scripture says: those who believe in him will have no cause for shame, it makes no distinction between Jew and Greek: all belong to the same Lord who is rich enough, however many ask his help, for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

Gospel

Luke 4:1-13

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.' Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anyone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God, and serve him alone.' Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said to him 'throw yourself down from here, for scripture says: He will put his angels in charge of vou to guard you, and again: They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.' But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.' Having exhausted all these ways of tempting him, the devil left him, to return at the appointed time.
