I SAW HIM ... Thank you to the parishioner who sent the following to be included on the bulletin.

I saw Him, I heard Him preach, I followed him, I watched Him teach. I saw Him cure the sick, the lame, I heard the people cry His name, I heard Him talk, that last time; He took a cup, filled it with wine. He raised the cup above His head, I drank the wine and ate the bread. He went alone that night to pray, I saw them dragging Him away. They lashed and whipped Him, drew His blood. They threw His body in the mud. I saw them place upon His head a crown of thorns, 'The King' they said. I saw His fear, I felt His pain, I saw the drops of blood, sweat, rain. They strapped the tree across His back, He fell, they beat; a wounded track. I saw the cross, I saw the nails, I saw His mother, cold and frail. I saw the sign above His head; 'This is the King of the Jews' I read. Darkness tore across the land, His words, "Father, into your hands." He raised His eyes up to the sky. He dropped His head, I watched Him die.
