According to an article on the BBC News Website today, Wednesday 13th July, a major UK study has found that mindfulness lessons in secondary schools are '...largely a waste of time...'

The article explains that mindfulness is intended to help those who practise it, basically a form of meditation, to focus on what is actually happening around them now, rather than dwell on the past or worry about the future. It's a bit more involved than this, hence me including the link for you to explore at your leisure. The article also makes it clear that the mindfulness exercises that the pupils were taught did in fact help some of them - but for others more targeted support would be better.

I'm not sure that's for me though, and I don't think it's that simple. I quite like looking back over things that have happened to me - bad times as well as good, since we can learn things from both of these experiences.

And I quite like looking forward to the future too, with all the promise that that holds. I wonder if this makes me a 'Martha' or a 'Mary'.

Maybe I'm a bit of both, I don't know.

First Reading

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground.

'My lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.'

They replied, 'Do as you say.' Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah.' 'Hurry,' he said 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree. 'Where is your wife Sarah?' they asked him. 'She is in the tent' he replied.
