Assumption of The Blessed Virgin Mary

In today's Gospel St. Luke gives us words that we use innumerable times in our prayers, the second part of the Hail Mary: "Elizabeth gives a loud cry and says: 'of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." "

With Elizabeth we honour Mary, she is blessed through the mysterious child she bears who will save all humanity.

As St. Paul puts it 'Just as all die in Adam, so all will be brought to life in Christ'. Our Lady's Assumption is the celebration of that promise, she shares fully in the resurrection life of her Son, Jesus. As Mary puts it in her great song of praise: 'the Almighty has done great things for me.'

The honour and blessedness of Mary reveals what will be our destiny too, all humanity is called to dignity to be clothed in Christ.

Of course, we live in a broken world, all of us are wounded to one degree or another. Mary teaches us that just as the Lord 'has looked upon his lowly handmaid', so he looks upon us with our weakness and limitation calling us to be witnesses to his saving, reconciling and healing

During the Fatima weekend in June and on our pilgrimage to Walsingham, we prayed for healing. Beginning from September we will celebrate, on the first Saturday morning of each month at St Joseph's Church, a Mass where the Sacrament of the Sick will be offered, there will be the opportunity for the Sacrament of Reconciliation after Mass, prayer for healing and opportunities for listening and hospitality.

Through this opportunity may we come with Mary to know, as she puts it: 'Holy is his name, and his mercy reaches from age to age!' May we, like Mary, bear her Son for others, and through faithful discipleship like hers, come to blessedness.

Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary -14th August2022

First Reading

Apocalypse 11:19,12:1-6,10

The sanctuary of God in heaven opened and the Ark of the Covenant could be seen inside it. Then came flashes of lightning, peals of thunder and an earthquake, and violent hail. Now a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman, adorned with the sun, standing on the moon, and with the twelve stars on her head for a crown. She was pregnant, and in labour, crying aloud in the pangs of childbirth. Then a second sign appeared in the sky, a huge red dragon which had seven heads and ten horns, and each of the seven heads crowned with a coronet. Its tail dragged a third of the stars from the sky and dropped them to the earth, and the dragon stopped in front of the woman as she was having the child, so that he could eat it as soon as it was born from its mother. The woman brought a male child into the world, the son who was to rule all the nations with an iron sceptre, and the child was taken straight up to God and to his throne, while the woman escaped into the desert, where God had made a place of safety ready, for her to be looked after in the twelve hundred and sixty days. Then I heard a voice shout from heaven, 'Victory and power and empire for ever have been won by our God, and all authority for his Christ, now that the persecutor, who accused our brothers day and night before our God, has been brought down.'

Luke 1:39-56

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death, for everything is to be put under his feet.

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'

And Mary said: 'My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord and my spirit exults in God my saviour; because he has looked upon his lowly handmaid. Yes, from this day forward all generations will call me blessed, for the Almighty has done great things for me. Holy is his name, and his mercy reaches from age to age for those who fear him. He has shown the power of his arm, he has routed the proud of heart. He has pulled down princes from their thrones and exalted the lowly. The hungry he has filled with good things, the rich sent empty away. He has come to the help of Israel his servant, mindful of his mercy—according to the promise he made to our ancestors—of his mercy to Abraham and to his descendants forever. Mary stayed with Elizabeth about three months and then went back home.
