The context for this Sunday's gospel is the right use of money, it should be used to help the poor. True wealth consists not in what we keep but in what we give away, possessions are a great responsibility. The Lord expects us to use them honestly and responsibly and to put them at his service and the service of others. We are God's servants and all that we have belongs to him. God loves generosity and he gives liberally to those who share his gifts with others. Love of money and wealth crowd out the love of God and love of neighbour. Jesus makes clear that our hearts must either be possessed by God's love or our hearts will be possessed by the love of something else.

**The Third Sunday in September, formerly called Home Mission Sunday, is now** *Evangelii Gaudium Sunday.* Named after Pope Francis' first (solo) Apostolic Exhortation on the Joy of the Gospel, the day offers the Catholic community in England and Wales the opportunity to celebrate the beauty of our faith and our commitment to witness to the fullness of life in Christ. The first thing is to pray for this work, to pray for our bishops in their outreach in all of these areas and their ministry. Evangelii Gaudium Sunday provides us with the opportunity to focus on spreading the Gospel in our local areas. Often when we hear the word 'Mission' it is associated with the valuable work of sharing our faith and helping people in other countries. Whilst this is still important, the Home Mission Office helps Catholics to share their faith with those they love, know and meet in their own environment. **There will be a second collection** this weekend.

Christ sent his disciples to proclaim the Good News to all the world. In all that we do may our lives bear witness to our love of Christ and our trust in His Word. Amen.
