Reflection 7th Sunday of Easter

We live in a culture where people don't like to wait! Things can be ordered online to be delivered within hours, we often expect instant responses to texts and emails. Today's information technology puts pressure on us to satisfy demands immediately.

However, we are sometimes in need of space and time to wait, indeed there are times when waiting cannot be avoided. It can be worrying, for example, waiting for medical test results, at other times the space may be boring, and we seek anxiously to fill it; or it can be exciting, anticipating a big life event like a new baby's arrival. The most precious things cannot be rushed.

In our relationship with God, in our spiritual life, we must embrace waiting, we are people on a pilgrimage through life, finding meaning, joy, contentment, forgiveness or longing for healing are not things that happen immediately, they are to be waited upon and journeyed towards.

In today's first reading the disciples, after the tumultuous events of Holy Week, Easter Sunday and the Ascension of the Lord, together with Our Lady, return to the upper room (Acts 1:14), they fill the waiting room with prayer. In the Gospel Jesus teaches us that 'eternal life is this: to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent.' (John 17: 3). We are given eternity to develop and grow in our relationship with God. Alone and together as a community of faith, we learn to wait upon grace, coming to know him more clearly, love him more dearly, follow him more nearly.

Try and create some regular time in your life just to be still, some silence. There are also opportunities in our churches during exposition of the Blessed Sacrament to be quiet and wait alongside each other in the company of Jesus. If you would like any advice or accompaniment in building silence into your life, just ask – that we may sit and wait in love.
