The readings this Sunday encourage us to praise God for all of the blessings in our lives. The first reading is a song of praise for the coming Kingdom of God. The second reading tells us to live by the Spirit, for the Spirit will bring life to our mortal bodies through Christ Jesus. In the gospel, Jesus praises the Father and then invites us to follow him, for he helps us when we are stressed and overwhelmed. He acknowledges the burdens we carry, the struggles we face, and He offers to lighten our load. Jesus assures us that the demands of God are not beyond our strength.

**Diocesan Listening Exercise:** As mentioned in Archbishop Malcolm's pastoral letter two weeks ago, he has begun a listening exercise across the diocese. Three initial meetings have been arranged at different locations across the Diocese. The nearest to our church will be held at English Martyrs and St. Peter & St Paul's Catholic Church, Stockton-on-Tees, TS19 9B, on **Thursday 13th July**, at 7pm to finish at 8.30pm.

**This Sunday is Sea Sunday.** It is a day for people to come together to pray for seafarers and thank them for the vital role they play in all of our lives. For seafarers, life at sea can be extremely challenging. They are often far from their families and loved ones for long periods of time, working long hours, and facing the threats of accidents, piracy and harsh weather conditions and when they come into port in a foreign land, they know no one. Amid these challenges, Stella Maris provides a beacon of hope and support to seafarers. Its chaplains and volunteers offer the hand of friendship and listen to the concerns of the seafarers they meet. They help seafarers to contact their families back home, take them to Mass, or arrange for a priest to come on board, provide transport to local shops, and help to resolve problems of missing pay or substandard conditions. Just as Jesus offers rest to those who are burdened and weary, Stella Maris offers refuge and support to seafarers who are facing the challenges of life at sea. Its chaplains and volunteers are the hands and feet of Jesus in this world, bringing comfort to seafarers. **There will be a second collection** for Stella Maris this weekend.

We pray for all seafarers and fishers, who work hard on the perilous sea, to bring us so many of the goods that we rely on in our daily lives. May they always feel the loving embrace of our Heavenly Father. We also pray for Stella Maris and its mission to be the hands and feet of Christ, bringing love, kindness and compassion to all those who visit our ports and shores. Amen.
