In this Sunday's gospel Jesus reveals to us that he is present in the needy and the vulnerable. Jesus is present in the Eucharist and he also offers to meet us in the hungry and thirsty, the stranger and the sick, the poor and the prisoner. This gospel passage challenges us to see the broken body of Jesus in the brokenness and vulnerability of people around us.

God, Father of the poor, your Son Jesus was born among us poor, humble and dependent. Open our eyes, our hearts and our hands to honour him now as our Lord and King by welcoming him in those who are hungry and thirsty, in all who are abandoned and lonely, in refugees, in the poor and the sick. Let our love become free and spontaneous, like the tenderness you have shown us in your Son. Welcome us in the everlasting Kingdom prepared for us through Christ Jesus our Lord. Amen.

This Sunday, the Feast of Christ the King, Pope Francis invites the global Church to celebrate and pray for young people. The theme this year is 'Rejoicing in Hope.'

Talk by Angela Wills: Dorothy Day was an American journalist, social activist and anarchist who, after a bohemian youth, became a Catholic without abandoning her social and anarchist activism. Pope Francis said, "Her social activism, her passion for justice and for the cause of the oppressed, were inspired by the Gospel, her faith and the example of the saints." Angela was born in Middlesbrough but has lived in Reading for the last 54 years. She spent ten years in the Pastoral Formation team of Portsmouth Diocese and now works with their Spirituality Formation Team as a Spiritual Director.
