## **Reflection – First Sunday of Lent**

Do you greet Lent with a sigh or even worse despair? May I encourage us all to greet Lent with Joy!

Our readings today remind us that God makes a promise to love us.

The story of the flood reminds us that life is sometimes a challenge, either we spoil it through our sinfulness or are wounded by events outside of our control. Whichever way, Lent reminds us that God does not leave us alone in the universe, he loves us; this season reminds us of his promise to forgive and heal us through the life, death and resurrection of his son – this is the Good News and the cause of our joy.

As we long for the things we've given up we remember our deepest longings for love and for God, as we renew our prayer we grow in our relationship with God and as we give alms we remember our human interdependence and support those less well off than ourselves.

We can be tempted by pessimism and cynicism, Jesus shows us that the response to temptation is to reaffirm our dependence on God; we are to trust in his love for all humanity.

May Lent be joyful as we renew our relationship with God and with each other – enjoy the gift and grace of reconciliation, healing and renewal that Lent offers.

The women started planning the service three years ago. The theme is particularly appropriate given the current situation in the Middle East. ### Readings 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday Lent

#### First reading Genesis 9:8-15

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.' God said, 'Here is the sign of the Covenant I make between myself and you and every living creature with you for all generations: I set my bow in the clouds and it shall be a sign of the Covenant between me and the earth. When I gather the clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the Covenant between myself and you and every living creature of every kind. And so the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all things of flesh.'

#### Responsorial Psalm Psalm 24(25):4-6,7b-9

R: Your ways, Lord, are faithfulness and love for those who keep your covenant.

1.Lord, make me know your ways. Lord, teach me your paths. Make me walk in your truth, and teach me: for you are God my saviour. 2.Remember your mercy, Lord, and the love you have shown from of old. In your love remember me, because of your goodness, O Lord.

3. The Lord is good and upright.

He shows the path to those who stray,
He guides the humble in the right path,
He teaches his way to the poor.

## Second reading 1 Peter 3:18-22

Christ himself, innocent though he was, died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life, and, in the spirit, he went to preach to the spirits in prison. Now it was long ago, when Noah was still building that ark which saved only a small group of eight people 'by water', and when God was still waiting patiently, that these spirits refused to believe. That water is a type of the baptism which saves you now, and which is not the washing off of physical dirt but a pledge made to God from a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has entered heaven and is at God's right hand, now that he has made the angels and Dominations and Powers his subjects.

### Gospel Mark 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the wilderness and he remained there for forty days, and was tempted by Satan. He was with the wild beasts, and the angels looked after him. After John had been arrested, Jesus went into Galilee. There he proclaimed the Good News from God. 'The time has come' he said 'and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News.'
