As our Lenten journey brings us nearer to Jerusalem, this week's readings promise us the hope of forgiveness and eternal life as we try to stay alongside Jesus in his suffering. Like Jesus, we, too, are made for eternal life, and are united with him as we serve him. In the Gospel, Jesus describes the grain of wheat that dies and is buried before it bears fruit. In the same way, Jesus himself will die and rise again, drawing all of us to him. Jesus found in his passion that God the Father is near, we can find that through helping people in times of suffering by listening and sharing.



St Patrick was a humble, pious, gentle man, whose love and total devotion to and trust in God is a shining example, so complete was his trust in God, and of the importance of his mission, he feared nothing.

**St Patrick came to Ireland to tell people about the love of God in Christ Jesus.** Thank you, Father, for sending your Son to die on the cross in our place, so that we can draw near to him. In the cross you have revealed to us your unfathomable love, mercy and forgiveness.
