The context for this Sunday's gospel is the right use of money. True wealth consists not in what we keep but in what we give away, possessions are a great responsibility. The Lord expects us to use them honestly and responsibly and to put them at His service and the service of others. We are God's servants and all that we have belongs to him. God loves generosity and he gives liberally to those who share his gifts with others. Love of money and wealth crowd out the love of God and love of neighbour. Jesus makes clear that our hearts must either be possessed by God's love or they will be possessed by the love of something else.

Evangelii Gaudium Sunday (Home Mission Sunday) ~ This year the Church has been celebrating a significant anniversary. It is 1,700 years since the Council of Nicaea, this great gathering of Bishops from around the Church began the work to formulate the creed we proclaim at Mass. It is the content of this creed that is our mission. At the heart of it all, the Christian must be a believer, to be able to say, "I believe." The Bishops of England and Wales ask parishes to pray for the work of evangelisation across our countries and to look for ways in which we can all do our part in sharing the beauty and joy of knowing Jesus Christ. This is very much our mission. **There will be a second collection after Mass this Sunday** to support the work carried out by the Bishops' Conference Mission Directorate. Through this directorate, the church is supported in a wide field of service and mission here in England and Wales.

Christ sent his disciples to proclaim the Good News to the world. In all that we do may our lives bear witness to our love of Christ and our trust in His Word. Amen.
