A major theme in the Gospel of Luke is the importance of the care of the poor in the life of discipleship. The parable in this Sunday's Gospel contrasts the life of a rich man and the poor man, Lazarus, who lives in the shadow of the rich man and his wealth. This story of Jesus highlights the inequality of rich and poor. Jesus appeals to our sense of justice and goodness. Each needy person that we pass is known to God by name and loved by God. Jesus is asking his listeners to open their eyes to what is around them, and to open their ears to the simple command of the gospel; love your neighbour.

Every Sunday there are now printed sheets available in the porch (near where you can pick up copies of this Newsletter) containing the **Readings and Prayers for that Mass** – in the new translation. Do pick up to use it, then take it home to read through again.
