In this Sunday's Gospel ten lepers met the Lord because they went searching for Him. All ten believed that Jesus had the power to help them. There are many things we ask God, big and small. We pray for calm in the midst of stress; we pray for comfort when we are afraid. Sometimes we cry out for healing like the lepers in the Gospel this Sunday. We pray with the hope and faith that God will hear us, that Jesus will have an answer for us. What distinguished the leper who returned from the other nine was that he recognized his healing as a gift, and he further recognized God as the source of this gift. A great deal of what we really value in life is gift, coming to us from beyond ourselves.

Prisoner's Sunday . . . Prisons Sunday marks the beginning of the ecumenical Prisons Week. This is an annual event that aims to raise awareness of the issues faced by prisoners, their families, victims of crime and those working within the criminal justice system. This year's theme is 'Jesus looked at him and loved him.' Reflecting the gospel reading, Prisons Week this year focuses on thankfulness. Pact is the national Catholic charity that supports prisoners, people with convictions and their families.
