Reflection 30th Sunday Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, Jesus gives the parable of two individuals who came to the temple to pray. One likely lived a righteous life due to his stature, yet blind to his flaws. The other, whose livelihood exploited his fellowmen's hardships, was quick to admit his faults. Both are Jews who worship the same God.

This weekend, our parish celebrates our diversity. But this diversity is not just the presence of various cultures and nationalities in our churches. We are a community of unique personalities, dreams, aspirations, habits, and priorities. We are all one-of-a-kind, but the world around us often magnifies our differences instead of our gifts. Sometimes, in our earnest desire to serve God, we may falter, judging others' differences rather than cherishing our unique contributions. We risk focusing on what others are doing differently, forgetting that we all worship the same Christ.

Our Lord calls us not to judge others, because that belongs to God alone. When we feel like pointing out someone's faults, or how someone does things differently, Christ shares a humble prayer, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Our diversity is a divine gift to us all. Together, we all form the Body of Christ, and this Body is unable to function well without the support of each member. Let us all grow in love for one another and celebrate the beautiful ways we are different.
